- Our Club opening day on 24th September was well attended. Diane Steel handled things very well on the day, in Trevor's absence.
- The club hosted the 18 World Cup Referees for a couple of games of bowls on Wednesday October 5th. We gave Andrew Saville the scoop and he arrived with a camera man in tow. - The Executive unanimously agreed at the August Executive Meeting to create two new membership categories. Those club members (husband and wife) who have paid \$300 will be charged an additional \$120 to bring the fees inline with what was agreed at the AGM.
